

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A abraghat College, known as Habraghat Mahavidyalaya dedicated to the glorious memory of "Habraghat Pargana" a revenue village of the erstwhile Bijni Raj State, was formally inaugurated on the auspicious day of 29th August, 1979 with 61 students in Pre University class under the aegis of a Sponsoring & Governing Body with a view to catering to the need of higher education of vast rural backward area bordering Meghalaya state centering round Krishnai pre-dominantly inhabited by people belonging to S.C., S.T., O.B.C., M.O.B.C. and minority communities of alarming socioeconomic condition.

The college situated in 36 Dudhnoi S.T. Constituency and located in the vicinity of Krishnai just 1 K.M. South from the N.H.37 was affiliated to Gauhati University in 1983 and was placed under deficit system of Grantsin-Aid w.e.f. 01-02-1986. The college has got permanent affiliation and has been registered under 2 (f) & 12 (B) of UGC act 1956 w.e.f. March, 2006.

The college has been offering Two-Year Higher Secondary Course and Three-Year Under Graduate Course in the faculty of Arts with Major in Assamese, Arabic, Economics, Education, English, History, Mathematics and Political Science. #### 3. Combination of Subjects in Higher Secondary Courses :

- ii) A student must select any three of four elective subjects from the following list :
  - 1. Economics
- 2. Education
- 3. Political Science 4. History / Mathematics
- 5. Advance Assamese / Arabic.

#### Pattern of Examination :

The Course is divided into two parts-One for H.S. First Year Examination and the other for H.S. Final Examination to be conducted by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council at the end of each academic session. The subject wise distribution of marks in each examination will be as follows:

#### 4. Eligibility Criteria :

#### (A) Admission to H.S. Courses:

(i) A student seeking admission into Higher Secondary First Year Class must have passed HSLC/AHM Examination conducted by SEBA/ CBSE or any other equivalent examinations conducted by recognized Board or Council.

(ii) A student seeking admission into Higher Secondary Second Year Class must have passed the H. S. First Year Examination conducted by the Council.

#### (B) Admission to Degree Courses :

A student seeking admission into B.A. first semester class must have passed 10+2 final examination as conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council or any other Board or Council as recognized by Gauhati University.

## 5. Internal Examination and Evaluation for H.S. Course :

In order to prepare the students for the external examinations conducted by AHSEC and with a view to getting necessary feedback, the college conducts the following internal examinations by the Internal Examination Board of the college as well as the respective departments:

(A) <u>Unit Test</u>: In each academic session there will be two Unit Tests for 20 Marks each to be conducted by respective department as per schedule to be announced in advance. Attendance in the Unit Test is compulsory.

(B) <u>Test Examination</u>: The Internal Examination Board of the college will conduct test examinations which will be treated as qualifying examination for appearing in the finals.

## 6. Courses and Programmes for B.A. Honours and Regular Under CBCS, GU

The College will offer the Three years Degree Course (TDC) in Arts (Semester basis) following the Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System (UGCBCS) under Gauhati University from the Academic Session 2019-2020. The Three years Degree Course will be of Six Semesters covering three calendar years. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semester will make up an academic year. The Academic Session covers from the month of 'June to May'. The Odd Semester (First, Third and Fift) duration shall be from 'June to November' and the Even Semester (Second, Fouth & Sixth) duration shall be from 'December to May'. The minimum time requirement for the undergraduate Degree Course will be three years and the maximum time allowed to complete the course is six years.

The College offers Honours (earlier known as Major) and Regular (earlier known as General) Course in Arts Stream. The students may opt Honours in the following subjects: 1. Assamese 2. Arabic 3. English 4. Education 5. Economics 6. History 7. Political Science

Simultaneously, the students may opt Regular Courses in the following subjects:

- 1. Arabic 2. Education 3. Economics 4. History
- 5. Political Science 6. Elective Assamese 7. Mathematics

#### Key Points of the B.A. Honours Course under CBCS :


A. In undergraduate Honours Course a student have to study 14 Core Papers of the subject concern carrying 6 credits each. Two (2) Core papers in each Semester of 1,2,5 & 6 and Three (3) Core papers in each Semester of 3 & 4 are to be studied by a B.A. Honours student.

B. The students of B.A. Honours Course have to study Two (2) papers as Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) for Semester of 1 & 2 (One paper for one Semester) carrying 4 credits each. The two compulsory AECC papers are English/MIL Communication and Environmental Science. A student is to select any one paper for a particular semester but not the same paper in both the semesters.

C. An undergraduate Honours Course student have to study Four (4) Generic Elective (GE) Papers in Semester 1,2,3 & 4 (One paper in each Semester). Each GE Paper will carry 6 credits. The papers will be as per the prescribed syllabus of Gauhati University.

D. The students shall require to study Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) one in each Semester 3 & 4. Each paper will carry 4 credits. The students shall have to study English as a mandatory paper in Semester 3 as SEC-1. For Semester 4, the SEC-2 paper will be decided by the college as per the Gauhati University syllabus.

E. The Honours Course students shall have to study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) which will be of 4 papers. Students shall study 2 papers in 5<sup>th</sup> Semester as well as 2 papers in 6th semester. Each DSE paper will carry 6 credits. The DSE papers will be according to the syllabus of Gauhati University. All students enrolled in B.A. Honours course will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credits DSE course in the 5<sup>th</sup> Semester only.

## KEY POINTS OF THE B.A. REGULAR COURSE UNDER CBCS :

A. In undergraduate Regular course a student have to study 12 Core course carrying 6 credits each. Where Two (2) DSC Papers in each Semester of 1,2,3 & 4 carrying 6 credits each along with English in Semester 1 & 2 carrying 6 credits each and MIL / Alt. English in Semester 3 & 4 carrying 6 credits each.

**B.** In Semester 1 & 2, students of Regular Course have to study Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) one paper in both the semester 1 & 2 carrying 4 credits in each paper. English Communication / MIL Communication of Environmental Science will be a AECC where students have to choose any one paper for one semester but not the same paper in both semesters.



C. A student opting Regular course have to study 4 Skill Enhancement paper in semester 3,4,5 & 6 (one in each semester) carrying 4 credits in each paper. The SEC paper will be decided by the college as per the Gauhati University syllabus.

D. The students Regular course shall have to study 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers, two in each of Semester 5 & 6. Each DSE papers will carry 6 credits. E. Students have to study two Generic Elective (GE) as the GE-1 for semester 5 and

GE-2 for Semester 6. The GE papers will carry 6 credits in each.

## **CREDIT AND ATTENDANCE :**

A. Credit is to be earned by the students in full and not in fraction.

B. Gauhati University set minimum 75% attendance in class as the requirement to earn full credit.

C. Without 75% attendance, the students will be debarred from attending in End Semester Examination.

D. The debarred students will continue their studies till final semester.

E. After completion of attending the others External Semester Examination (ESE), is the debarred students will have to attend the classes to earn the required credits for 15the debarred semester. V.S

F. Only then, they will be allowed to appear in both internal as well as the External Semester Examination of debarred semester.

G. Internal Assessment will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course / paper. This 20% will be again divided in the following sections:

(a) A Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for internal Assessment of a course / paper.

(b) 20% of the marks allotted for internal Assessment will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for Internal Assessment is 20, than 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. In this case following criteria will be adopted :

- 1) Class attendance from 76% to 80% = 1 Mark
- = 2 Marks 2) Class attendance from 81% to 85%
- = 3 Marks 3) Class attendance from 86% to 90%
- 4) Class attendance from 91% and above = 4 Marks

(c) Rest 30% of the marks allotted for Internal Assessment will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:

- 1) Home Assignments
- 2) Seminer / Group discussions
- 3) Field Work
- 4) Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

#### 8. Combination of Subjects in Three Year Degree Course :

i) English, MIL (Assamese) and Environmental Studies (in 3rd & 4th Semester) are compulsory for all. 

ii) A student offering General Course must select two elective subjects from the following list of combination while a student offering Major Course must select one of the elective subjects as general excluding the Major subject of his/her choice.

Combination of Subject : (i) Economics (iv) History/Mathematics

(ii) Education iii) Political Sciencev) Elective Assamese /Arabic.

\*A student offering Mathematics must have passed mathematics of the (10+2) standard.

## 9. Regulation of TDC for Semester System :

i) TDC shall be of Six Semesters covering three calendar years. The schedule or semester system shall be as shown below :

a) First, Third and Fifth Semester : August-01 to Dec-31 (including examinations)
b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester : January-01to June-30 (including examinations)
c) Semester Break: July-01 to July-31

ii) Student's performance will be monitored though out the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical will be based on the following:

\*Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks

\*External Evaluation: 80% Marks

iii) Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examination, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each semester.

iv) External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the semester. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%.

v) In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.

vi) A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:

a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester Examination.

- b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester Examination.
- c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester examination.

d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester examination.

vii) A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Semester and may be allowed for "betterment "of marks in one paper in the 5th Semester provided the student secure less than 45% marks in paper.

viii) No "repeat" / "betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any semester.

ix) A student must pass all his semester examinations including "repeat" "betterment" chances within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular semester.

x) In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events the matter may be placed in the Committee of Course and Studies (U.G.) for amicable settlements.

xi) Since the semester involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.

xii) For any matter not covered under this Regulation for semester system, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) should be applicable.

#### 10. Medium of Instruction :

The medium of instruction in major subjects is English but for other options the medium of instruction is Assamese & English.

#### 11. Admission Procedure :

(A) Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college along with prospectus on payment of Rs. 100.00 only.

(B) Admission is made in order of merit as per admission rules after due scrutiny of the relevant documents by the admission committee.

(C) Applicant will have to produce the following documents in original at the time of The The interview / admission.

i) Mark sheet and admit card of the last qualifying examination.

ii) Pass certificate from the concerned authority.

iii) Caste certificate (wherever necessary) from the component authority.

(In case there is a study gap not more than three years) A gap certificate from the head of the institution attended last.

(D) Applicants willing to offer major courses must have minimum 40% marks in aggregate and 45% marks in the subject of his/her choice in the last qualifying examination. Moreover, sitting in the merit test to be conducted by the concerned department is also compulsory.

# 12. General Rules for Maintenance of Discipline Among Students :

The college authority strictly adheres to the rules and regulation of the college for maintenance of discipline among the students. Every student is expected to abide by these rules and regulation as prescribed by the college.

A student to be eligible for appearing in the Council/University examination must attend 75% of the total lectures delivered in each subject/paper during the academic session. Unsatisfactory progress report will disqualify him/her to appear in the finals.



• All forms of ragging in the college campus is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action as deemed fit by the Vigilance Committee, may be taken if anyone found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.

• Student's Union or any other Association shall be subject to the rules and regulation of the college administration.

• The students must keep away from drugs, drinks and such other activities as detrimental to the ever flourishing academic atmosphere of the college.

• Violation of any of the above mentioned condition will make a student liable for punishment such as termination of scholarship, rustication, expulsion etc.

• All power of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the institution.

#### 13. Identity Card & College Uniform :

Every student should have his/her non-transferable I-cards duly endorsed by the Principal. No student will be allowed to attend classes without the college uniforms as prescribed by the college authority.

#### 14. Awards & Scholarship :

Apart from SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/Merit Scholarships by State & the Central Govt. the college with a view to encourage meritorious students in their pursuit for excellency, awards free-studentship for one year term to the students securing highest marks (not less than 70%) in the last qualifying examination.

#### 15. Library Facility :

The central library of the college is housed in its own building and is enriched with a stock of 15,500 books. Besides there are a good number of magazines and journals subscribed regularly for the benefit of the students. There is a computer lab with internet facilities for both the teachers and students. The library of the college, accommodated with the reading room facilities for the teachers and students, remains open during the working hours of the college. The students are allowed to borrow books through their library cards to be collected from the librarian. Borrowers must return the books within the specified time and are personally responsible for the loss or damage of any book borrowed.

# 16. Students' Union & Co-curricular Activities :

Habraghat College Students' Union (HCSU) is the general body of the students of the college. The office bearers of the union are democratically elected for one year term. To promote all-round development of the students and to inculcate a social sense in the minds of the students, the Union with the active co-operation of the teachers in-charge organizes various co-curricular activities and competitions mainly in games & sports, debates, cultural items, social service, literary competition etc. among the students. The Union also publishes College Magazine and Wall Magazine as a medium for developing literary potentialities of the students.







#### 17. N.S.S. Unit :

The college has a National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit under the guidance of a trained Programme Officer to provide opportunities to the students not only to develop personality but also to serve the society while carrying out various welfare programmes.

#### 18. Counselling and Career Guidance Cell:

There is a Counseling and Career Guidance Cell in the college to help the student in providing necessary information and guidance leading to their promising future.

#### 19. Special Award to Meritorious Students :

With a view to encouraging the meritorious students who have acquired excellence in the H.S. & B.A. Final Examinations Conducted by AHSEC and GU, the College has introduced the following awards in cash with effect from 2010.

- i) Award of Rs. 5000.00 (five thousand) only each to the students securing 1st class in B.A. final examination.
- ii) Award of Rs. 4000.00 (four thousand) only each to the students securing 80% marks in the H.S. final examination.
- iii) Award of Rs. 3000.00 (three thousand) only each to the students securing 75% marks in the H.S. final examination.

#### 20. Hostel Facilities :

The college has hostel facilities for both boys and girls within the campus. Students who desire to get admission into hostel are to fill up separate admission forms.
